President's Report

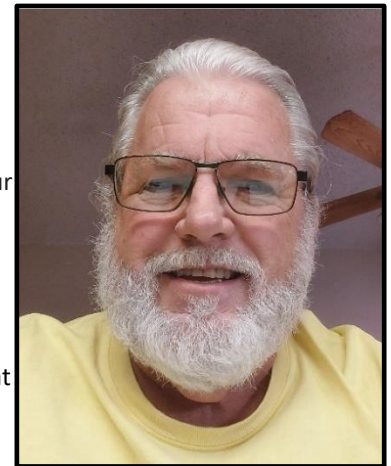

Preparing for 2024 Legislative Session: Looking Ahead

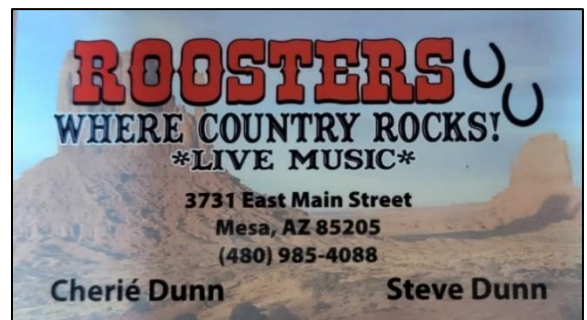
As advocates for motorcyclists' rights and safety, ABATE of Arizona is gearing up for the 2024 legislative session. Our mission is to preserve motorcyclists' freedoms, promote safe riding, and improve the image of motorcycling to the general public. We have identified several policy recommendations that align with these goals, and we are ready to hit the ground running. Here's what we'll be focusing on:

- 1. Motorcycle Awareness Campaigns:** Lobby for increased funding for public awareness campaigns aimed at educating other drivers about sharing the road with motorcycles to increase safety.
- 2. Defensive Riding Programs:** Push for state funding for defensive riding courses, which can provide motorcyclists with the skills they need to navigate the roads safely.
- 3. Road Design and Maintenance:** Advocate for considerations for motorcyclists in road design and maintenance, including elimination of grooved pavement and other conditions hazardous to motorcycles.
- 4. Motorcycle Parking:** Encourage municipalities to include motorcycle-friendly parking in their city planning efforts.
- 5. Anti-Profiling Measures:** Lobby for legislation that prevents law enforcement from profiling individuals based solely on their choice to ride a motorcycle.
- 6. E15 Fuel:** Push for clearer labeling of E15 fuel, which can be harmful to motorcycles, or lobby for a ban on its use entirely.
- 7. Noise Ordinance Reforms:** Work on reforming noise ordinances that unfairly target motorcyclists or establish motorcycle-specific regulations

September 21-24, 2023 The Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) hosted their 39th annual Meeting of the Minds at Red Lion Hotel in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. It was an excellent venue for the conference.

On Thursday, the MRF conducts an all-day Board meeting. I arrived in time to make it to the 7PM - 9PM Meet & Greet – SMRO (State Motorcycle Rights Organization) updates. This is where each state has an opportunity to present 3 topics they worked on during the past year, what worked and what didn't work for them.

Friday morning started off with General Sessions 9AM - 12PM. Hardtail, MRF President, made opening comments with this year's theme being COLLABORATION, bringing ALL motorcycle organizations and industries together for the common goal and MRF's mission: "the pursuit of promoting, protecting and preserving the future of motorcycling and motorcyclists' rights". We are currently facing our biggest fight: KEEPING THE INTERNAL COMBUSTION ENGINE (ICE) legal, as the world-wide agenda is to transition to electric vehicles.

Rocky Fox, MRF Lobbyist, gave an update on MRF legislative priorities and the dysfunctional inner workings on The Hill, who are our trusted allies, and who are not. Dave Dwyer and Ryan Hubbard presented State & Federal Legislative Awards to those who got positive legislation passed. Kris Cook, MRF Treasurer, gave the annual MRF Financial Report. They are in a good financial position, with a years' worth of operating expenses in the bank and highest number of members ever.

That being said, we still need to acquire MORE MRF MEMBERS. When the "green" legislation hits the U.S.A., trying to ban ICE's and declaring "end-of-life" of your beloved machines, requiring you turn in your old ICE motorcycles and all their parts for demolition, we will need a LOUD & CLEAR VOICE that we will not stop riding or surrender our motorcycles. This is already happening in Europe; the time is NOW to ban together and project a strong voice.

Friday afternoon, a top officer from each SMRO attends a session to review MRF's legislative agenda and create the 2024 Federal legislative agenda. These topics are based on High, Medium and Low Priorities. A separate publication from the MRF dated Sept. 22nd reflects the vast topics I won't cover here.

Breakout sessions offered Friday afternoon included; First Timers, Building Effective Legislative/Lobbying Efforts, SMRO Guidebook: "A Cookbook for Your Organization", Leadership Principles, Keeping the Bridge Open Between Clubs & SMRO's.

A silent auction was held Friday until 5PM. I assisted Tammy Ward-Railsback, ABATE of KS, by texting all 53 bid winners of the item they won, \$ due and time to pay.

Friday 7PM-10PM offered "The 70's Disco Casino Night" fundraiser for MRF PAC. People came decked out in their bell bottoms, disco shirts and platforms.

Saturday 9AM – 12PM was another general session featuring Jay Jackson, MRF VP, American Income Life features and benefits, MRF PAC and Sherman Packard (keynote speaker) who is a New Hampshire House Rep., former Speaker of the House and NHMRO founder. There was a panel discussion regarding “The Future of Motorcycling”, the intentional phasing out of the internal combustion engine and their fuel source featuring Keith “Bandit” Ball, Bob Kay, Chris Callen and Hardtail. This is serious, folks. The world governments don’t want you to have an ICE motorcycle. We’re going to have to band together if we’re going to save our lifestyle.

From the Arizona Capitol Times

At 60 years old, Rep. Quang Nguyen, R-Prescott Valley, often finds himself driving home from the Capitol in an unusual fashion for men his age, cruising down state highways on his white and red sport motorcycle.

"I just love my alone time with the wind ... It's still a lot of fun. You get the wind. We call it wind therapy," Nguyen said. "After a big, long day at the Capitol, usually I get home kind of early evening. Usually what I do, I go for a ten-mile ride or something just to get the pressure off of you, to get the pulse back to you again and it's relaxing," he continued.

All while obeying traffic laws and speed limit postings, he noted.

Nguyen said his motorcycle hobby is important to him and represents his ideology as a state representative. Riding his motorcycle brings him a sense of independence that he said he holds himself to at the Capitol.

"I tend to do things independently," Nguyen said. "When I go to work, I close my door and I read bills and I think independently because everything in my life is independent ... I don't allow a big group of people to tell me how to vote. I want to be able to vote for my own constituents because they're the ones who sent me down there."

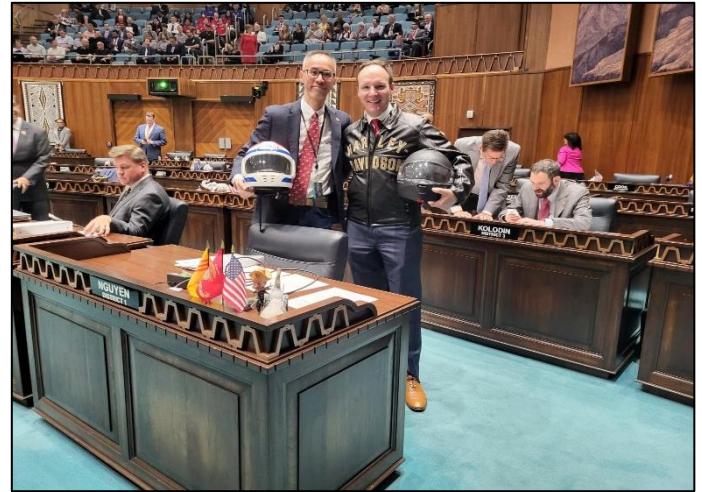
Nguyen's first vehicle was a used motorcycle he bought when he was 16 that he drove through high school. He rode up until his first child was born when he was 31 before giving up riding so he could help raise his family, but he never lost his passion for riding.

He gradually started riding again after both his son and daughter left the house and transitioned into adulthood, borrowing his friend's motorcycle from time to time. In April, he bought a Honda CBR 929RR, a high-performance sports bike manufactured in the early 2000s.

His license plate number reads "R LD1," referencing his political party and representation in Legislative District 1.

Nguyen expressed interest in eventually trading in his sport bike for something that's easier on his back. Riding now is a completely different experience than when he was in his teens and 20s when he felt a feeling of invincibility on the roads, Nguyen said. As a younger man, Nguyen said he frequented racetracks to push his bike to its limits and braved the roadways with actions he wouldn't do today like dragging his knees.

"Now there's a little bit of fear," Nguyen said. "I'll be 61 here in October. My reaction probably is a little bit slower and I respect the fact that I still have a wife and I still want to walk my daughter down the aisle ... I tend to be more obedient to the traffic rules if you can imagine that."



Nguyen's passion for motorcycle riding is no secret at the Capitol. On May 3, Nguyen and Rep. Matt Gress, R-Phoenix, dedicated the day to motorcycle safety awareness and a proclamation about the topic was read on the House floor. *(see picture above)*

Motorcycle crashes totaled nearly 2,600 in Arizona during 2021, according to a [report](#) from the Arizona Department of Transportation. While this accounted for just over 1% of total crashes from that year, motorcycle crashes are among the deadliest. Out of 664 vehicle deaths from that year, 154 people died from a motorcycle incident.

"Please look twice. Believe it or not, it'll save lives," Nguyen said before the proclamation was read on May 3. "To all the riders out there, we do have the same responsibility of looking around and putting your head on a swivel."

Nguyen said he enjoys the peaceful moments he has to himself when he's riding his motorcycle or tinkering on it in the garage. Like his other hobbies in flyfishing and oil painting, he enjoys quiet time to himself and said it's important for state legislators to find outlets they enjoy.

"If you think politics 24/7, there's something wrong with that attitude and I just don't do that," Nguyen said. "You know you see these guys 29, 30, 33, 34 down there – these guys don't have hobbies that I can tell."

Not talking politics is Nguyen's main rule as chairman of the Legislative Asian Caucus, which typically features a few legislators that have included both Republicans and Democrats meeting every week at a restaurant to have dinner and get to know each other.

But not everyone was receptive to Nguyen's ban on political discussions. Rep. Leezah Sun, D-Phoenix, started an Asian American Pacific Islander Caucus with Sen. Priya Sundareshan, D-Tucson. Nguyen said Sun invited him to her group but the two had differences on the level of political discussions that should occur within their groups.

"We get enough partisanship all day long and I didn't want to do that," Nguyen said.



Once you've decided to ride, there are a lot of choices to be made. What kind of bike? New or used? How much insurance? What kind of protective gear? It can get very expensive. So if you've chosen to wear a helmet, we'd like to make sure you buy a good one.

The Arizona Motorcycle Safety and Awareness Foundation (AMSAF) and Governor's Office of Highway Safety (GOHS) want to help. Our Financial Assistance Helmet program provides individuals with \$125 from AMSAF and 25% off the Manufacturer's suggested retail price (MSRP) when you purchase a DOT-approved, full face or modular helmet at AMSAF approved locations throughout the state.

How it works

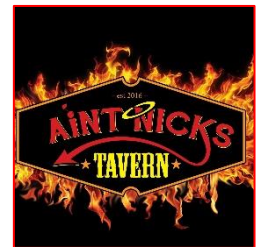
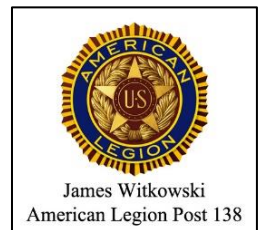
- AMSAF Vouchers are valid towards the purchase of a \$200.00 or higher DOT Certified Full Face or Modular Street Helmet.
- Vouchers are only valid to those dealers approved by AMSAF and listed on the AMSAF website.
- Vouchers are not valid for discounted, special order or discontinued helmets.
- Purchased helmet is non-returnable if warning tag is cut off. Helmets may be returnable at the discretion of the dealer.
- Voucher is valid for a \$125.00 credit toward qualified helmet due to grant received from the Governor's Office of Highway Safety.
- Dealer or store will give an additional 25% off of Helmet MSRP.
- \$50.00 tax deductible donation is required to AMSAF at time of application.
