
He is survived by an estranged wife and a sister in another state. To my knowledge, he had no children. However, he had many, many friends in the area and will be sorely missed by all of them.

# Former AMA President Ed Youngblood Passes Away at 80

Youngblood spearheaded the AMA's efforts from 1981 to 1999

# PICKERINGTON, Ohio —

The American Motorcyclist Association is saddened to hear about the passing of former AMA President Ed Youngblood on March 10,

2024, and offers condolences to his family, friends and colleagues. Youngblood was 80 years old.

Born on Sept. 28, 1943, in Muskogee, Okla., Youngblood bought his first bike — a 165cc Harley-Davidson — at the age of 14. After graduating from college with a master's degree, he went to work with AMA Motorcycle Hall of Famers Chuck and Sharon Clayton as an editor of *Cycle News East*. In 1970, Youngblood joined the AMA staff as managing editor of *AMA News*, which later was replaced by *American Motorcyclist*. In 1978, he was put in charge of the AMA's government relations department.

In 1981, Youngblood was appointed AMA executive director. He led the organization until 1999. During his tenure, Youngblood focused on improving member communication, growing the AMA's government relations efforts, and building stronger ties to the Fédération Internationale de Motocyclisme. For 25 years Youngblood was a delegate to the FIM, and he eventually became the deputy president, which was the second-highest rank in the organization.

Youngblood also helped establish the AMA Motorycle Hall of Fame. He was instrumental in forming the American Motorcycle Heritage Foundation in the early 1980s to raise funds for the Hall of Fame Museum. The American Motorcycle Heritage Museum was opened in 1990 within the AMA's old headquarters in Westerville, Ohio.



During Youngblood's tenure the AMA's headquarters was relocated to Pickerington, Ohio — which remains the AMA's home today. The American Motorcycle Heritage Museum followed the AMA to Pickerington, assuming a new name: The AMA Motorcycle Hall of Fame Museum. Youngblood resigned from the AMA to focus on his interests in history and writ-

ing in 1999 and was inducted into the AMA Motorcycle Hall of Fame later that year.



# LANE FILTERING IS LEGAL

ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES 28-903 F The operator of a two-wheeled motorcycle may overtake and pass

another vehicle that is stopped in the same direction of travel and in the same lane as the operator and may operate the motorcycle between lanes of traffic if the movement may be made safely and if the operator does both of the following:

- Operates the motorcycle on a street that both:
- (a) Is divided into at least two adjacent traffic lanes in the same direction of travel.
- (b) Has a speed limit that does not exceed forty-five miles per
- Travels at a speed that does not exceed fifteen miles per hour.

# **Legislative Report**

# ABATE of Arizona's Advocacy Efforts: A Mid-Session Update and Call to Action

ABATE of Arizona, the state's largest motorcycle rights organization, has been actively advocating for the rights and safety of motorcyclists during the first half of the Arizona legislative session. As we approach the midpoint of the session, it's crucial to reflect on our achievements, ongoing efforts, and the importance of continued participation from our members and supporters.

# Successful Lobby Day

One of the highlights of this session so far has been our successful Lobby Day. Our members descended upon the state Capitol, making our presence felt and our voices heard. We met with legislators, shared our concerns, and advocated for policies that protect and promote the interests of motorcyclists in Arizona. The unity and passion displayed by our members were palpable, and we are grateful for everyone who took the time to participate in this crucial event. A shout out to Senator Bolick for taking the time to have a picnic lunch with us.

# The Secure Load Bill: An Ongoing Effort

One of our primary focuses this session has been the secure load bill (SB 1376), sponsored by Senator Shawnna Bolick. This bill aims to address the

issue of unsecured loads on vehicles on ALL roadways, which pose a significant risk to motorcyclists and other road users. Debris from unsecured loads can lead to dangerous road conditions and accidents, often with severe consequences for motorcyclists. There were over 700 fatalities in Arizona last year alone. We need this to get across the finish line.

We have been working tirelessly to garner support for this bill, emphasizing the importance of road safety and the need for stricter regulations on securing loads. While we have made progress, the bill is still in the legislative process, and we continue to advocate for its passage. We urge our members and supporters to reach out to their legislators and express their support for SB1376 - Vehicle loads; restrictions. Your voices can make a difference in ensuring that this crucial safety measure becomes law.

# Motorcycle Day at the Dome: A Call to Action

As we look ahead, we are gearing up for one of the most important events of the year: Motorcycle Day at the Dome, scheduled for April 13th. This event is a vital opportunity for motorcyclists from across the state to come together, meet with legislators, and show our strength in numbers. advocate for positive change.



Safety, what is it? It is freedom from the occurrence or risk of injury, danger, or loss; the quality of averting or not causing injury, danger, or loss; a contrivance or device to prevent injury or avert danger. So, in more simple terms, it is situational - related to thinking. Freedom and ABATE go hand and hand. We have the freedom to educate our fellow motorcyclists and the community at large to motorcycle safety. I love the bumper stickers that say 'Look Out For Motorcycles'. From an impromptu survey done at the Cycle Gear bike nights... When riders were asked 'what is the most important piece of safety equipment', the top 3 responses have been helmet,


gloves, and your BRAIN. We need to be ever-vigilant for our own safety.

The number one response to why a motorcyclist was hit is, "I did not see you". It is shown that controlled movements catch the eye of cage drivers. Riders who move their bikes within their lane are seen better than those whose position remains static within their lane. Be prepared, have an escape plan, always be thinking. Hopefully you'll never need it, but Accident Scene Management could save your life and/or the life of a friend.


The last thing I need to say is, as a motorcycle rights organization, we need to be ever vigilant in our safety and the safety of other riders. Please take the time to learn proper lane filtering and share that knowledge with anyone who will listen. There is a new presentation out there which includes questions, as well as a self-test, on the topic. This is great. If groups will give you the time, share it. It is every member's job to Educate. It is part of our Acronym and it is part of what ABATE is all about.

O'Kelley's is located at 2120 West Guadalupe inMesa. It is open Monday – Saturday 6am-2am and Sunday 9a – 2am.



NHTSA On Notice Again

On March 9th, President Biden signed a Congressionally passed spending bill that funds half of the Federal Government's operations through the end of September. Funding for the U.S. Department of Transportation and the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), was included within this bill.

Attached to the spending bill is something called a committee report. The committee report allows Congress to provide further direction to the agencies it funds regarding intent of the law and asks the agency to report on issues of concern. For the second year in a row, the committee report attached to the transportation funding portion of the bill asks NHTSA to report on the issue of motorcyclist profiling. Congress is requesting this again because NHTSA failed to produce the original report requested during the last Congress.

The new language points out the past failure of the required response from NHTSA while again seeking answers on motorcyclist profiling. It states,

"The Committee remains concerned that the NHTSA may be conducting activities that encourage states to adopt legislation, regulations, or other policies that unjustly profile motorcycle riders. In fiscal year 2023, House Report 117-402 directed the NHTSA to report to the House and Senate Committees on Appropriations on the extent to which the agency works with states on motorcycle passenger policies. The Committee urges the NHTSA to expeditiously submit the report."

It's very frustrating that NHTSA has failed to do what Congress asked. However, the Motorcycle Riders Foundation (MRF) is thankful that Congress has reinforced the need for this report from NHTSA. Representative Susie Lee (D-NV) has and continues to lead the charge on this issue with NHTSA. Representative Lee is a 2023 MRF Legislative Champion who remains committed to supporting bikers and our priorities. Thank you to Rep. Lee and her fellow lawmakers who have supported our efforts to raise the issue of motorcyclist profiling.
