I hope that all of our chapters have partaken in various events to promote motorcycle safety around our state. Thank you to everyone for all you do to make Arizona safe for ALL motorcyclists.

Southern Arizona Chapter has once again sponsored their annual Fisher House Run in support of our veterans and their families at the Veterans Administration Hospital in Tucson. This year the run was held in May due to scheduling conflicts. The turnout was good and I only know of one bike that broke down which unfortunately was mine. I encourage all who believe in the Freedom of the Road to join ABATE of Arizona if you have not already done so. Even



The Arizona Motorcycle Safety and Awareness Foundation Financial Assistance Helmet Program

How it works

- AMSAF Vouchers are valid towards the purchase of a \$200.00 or higher DOT Certified Full Face or Modular Street Helmet.
- Vouchers are only valid to those dealers approved by AMSAF and listed on the AMSAF website.
- Vouchers are not valid for discounted, special order or discontinued helmets.
- Purchased helmet is non-returnable if warning tag is cut off. Helmets may be returnable at the discretion of the dealer.
- Voucher is valid for a \$125.00 credit toward qualified helmet due to grant received from the Governor's Office of Highway Safety.
- . Dealer or stere will give an additional 25% off of Helmet MSRP.
- \$50.00 tax deductible donation is required to AMSAF at time of application.
- . Voucher and promo code is only valid toward one (1) Helmet purchase.
- Dealer will credit individual up front at time of purchase and invoice AMSAE

LANE FILTERING IS LEGAL

The operator of a two-wheeled motorcycle may overtake and pass

another vehicle that is stopped in the same direction of travel and in the same lane as the operator and may operate the motorcycle between lanes of traffic if the movement may be made safely and if the operator does both of the following:

- Operates the motorcycle on a street that both:
- (a) Is divided into at least two adjacent traffic lanes in the same direction of travel.
- (b) Has a speed limit that does not exceed forty-five miles per
- Travels at a speed that does not exceed fifteen miles per hour.

The Importance of Securing Your Load

Every year, unsecured loads on vehicles cause thousands of accidents on our roads, leading to injuries and even fatalities. Recognizing the critical importance of this issue, Arizona has taken a proactive step with the introduction of Senate Bill 1376, sponsored by Senator Shawnna Bolick. This legislation expands the requirement to secure loads from just highways to all roadways across Arizona. With National Secure Your Load Day on June 6th, it's a timely reminder of the potentially life-saving importance of this simple yet crucial practice.

The Impact of Unsecured Loads

Recent statistics from the <u>National Highway Traffic Safety Administration</u> (NHTSA) paint a stark picture of the dangers posed by unsecured loads:

- In 2020 alone, unsecured loads led to 82,479 crashes nationwide.
- These incidents resulted in 16,595 injuries and 715 fatalities.
- In Arizona, since 2019, unsecured loads have caused 4,589 crashes and 22 fatalities.

These numbers are not just statistics; they represent families impacted, lives cut short, and communities shaken by preventable tragedies.

Understanding SB1376

Senate Bill 1376 is a legislative response to these alarming figures, designed to tighten load-securing regulations and enhance road safety. By extending the requirement to secure loads to all roadways, not just highways, the bill aims to reduce the likelihood of debris-related crashes. This is a significant step forward in our collective responsibility to ensure safer



travel for everyone on the road.

Why Securing Your Load is Essential

Securing your load would not just be a legal requirement; it's a critical safety practice. An unsecured load can quickly become a deadly projectile, endangering not only the driver but everyone else on the road. Properly securing items in a vehicle or on a trailer:

- * Prevents items from falling off and causing accidents or road obstructions.
- * Reduces the risk of losing valuable cargo.
- * Ensures compliance with traffic laws, avoiding fines and penalties.

How to Secure Your Load Effectively

- 1. Use Appropriate Restraints: Tie-downs, cargo nets, and ropes should be appropriately rated for the weight and type of load you are carrying.
- 2. Cover Loose Material: For loads like sand, dirt, or small debris, use a sturdy cover or tarp to prevent spillage.
- 3. Regular Checks: Regularly check your load, especially on long trips, to ensure that it remains securely fastened.
- 4. Follow Manufacturer's Guidelines: Utilize the load-securing points provided by your vehicle's manufacturer for maximum safety.

As we observe <u>National Secure</u> <u>Your Load Day</u>, let us all commit to this simple yet effective practice. By securing our loads, we contribute to safer roadways and protect lives. Remember, a secure load is a safe load!



Legislative Update

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

This Legislative Report provides the most current information about bills that could impact motorcyclists. May 1, 2024 is the 115th day of the Second Regular Session of the 56th Arizona State Legislature. To date, 1,761 bills have been introduced and staff continues to review these measures to identify potential impacts. Please note the highlighted sections represent bills newly added to this report and bills stricken out are considered "dead" at this point.

HB2332 - Traffic; vehicle laws; cities; prohibition

Sponsor Rep. Cesar Aguilar (D)
Summary: Prohibits local authorities from enacting or enforcing an ordinance or regulation that prohibits "cruising" (defined) or limits motor vehicle suspension modifications or bumper heights. AS PASSED HOUSE.

Ch. 70, Laws 2024 (HB2370 - Oxygenated fuel; federal approval; extension)

Sponsor Rep. Gail Griffin (R)

Summary: Extends the deadline for the United State Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to approve proposed modifications to the gasoline fuel formulation requirements to July 1, 2027 so that Laws 2017, Chapter 295, Section 2 becomes effective. Contains emergency clause. AS PASSED HOUSE.

HB2426 - Off-highway vehicle; temporary registration (Technical correction; traffic violations)

Sponsor Rep. Timothy M. Dunn (R) Summary: Permits the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) to issue temporary registrations if a person is a nonresident who owns an "off-highway vehicle" (defined) that is titled in another state and otherwise meets vehicular requirements per state law. Exempts owners of an off-highway vehicle that qualifies under the above registration requirements from the once every 12 months registration limit. AS PASSED HOUSE.

HB2522 - Defensive driving schools; fees

Sponsor Rep. Michele Pena (R)

Summary: Requires the court of record or a vendor that is contracted by the court to collect the court diversion fee and surcharge before a person attends driving school. Removes the requirement for the school to collect the fee and transfer it to the court. Requires the defensive driving school to collect the fee for its services before a person attends driving school. Requires a vendor that is contracted by the court for processing payments to confirm the person's eligibility and comply with rules relating to procurement. Effective April 1, 2025. AS PASSED BY HOUSE.

HB2545 - Annual vehicle emissions testing; exemption

HB2546 - Vehicle emissions; exemption

Sponsor Rep. Rachel Jones (R)

Summary: Includes vehicles manufactured before the 2018 model year in any references to covered vehicles under the Act as it pertains to inspection, registration, sales, leasing, vehicle classes, and both tampering and emissions testing. Exempts vehicles manufactured after the 2018 model year from any requirement by the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) pertaining to enforcing this Act. Requires approval from the United States Environmental Protection Agency for modifications to the vehicle emissions testing program as part of the Arizona implementation plan for air quality by July 1, 2027, for this Act to become effective and for the ADEQ to notify the Director of the Arizona Legislative Council before September 1, 2027 of the date the condition was met or not met. AS PASSED HOUSE.

fuel dispenser labeling or posting requirements to be \$100 total instead of \$100 for each day the violation continues and requires the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) to provide labels to vendors in bulk. AS PASSED HOUSE.

HB2866 - Electric vehicles; registration fee

Summary: Establishes a \$135 registration fee for motor vehicles that are fueled exclusively by electricity and have been issued an Alternative Fuel Vehicle Special Plate or Sticker by the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT). Due to a potential increase in state revenue, this legislation requires the affirmative vote of at least 2/3 of the members of each house of the Legislature for passage, and becomes effective on signature of the Governor.

HCR2018 - Tax prohibition; vehicle mileage; monitoring

Sponsor Rep. Travis Grantham (R) Summary: The 2024 general election ballot is to carry the question of whether to amend Article IV of the Constitution of Arizona, prohibiting the state, and any county, city, town, municipal corporation, or other political subdivision, from imposing a tax or fee on any person based on the vehicle miles traveled by the person in a motor vehicle, or enact any rule or law to monitor or limit the vehicle miles traveled by a person in a motor vehi-

cle unless the rule or law requires that the person voluntarily consents to the monitoring or limitation. Stipulates that this change does not apply to an interstate agreement to administer the payment or reporting of fuel taxes for registration fees for commercial vehicles that operate in more than one state. AS PASSED HOUSE.

SB1003 - Prohibition; photo radar

SB1010 - Vehicle mileage; tracking; tax; prohibitions

Summary: Prohibits a city, town, county or political subdivision from considering or establishing Vehicles Miles Travel Reduction goals for use with state projects; or track or maintain a record of personal vehicle miles of travel records (via odometer readings, cameras, or any other means of recording) of any person; or impose any mileage fee or tax on miles traveled by an individual in a motor vehicle.

SB1052 - All-terrain vehicles; definition

Sponsor Sen. Frank Carroll (R)

Summary: Increases the maximum weight from 2,500 pounds to 3,500 pounds in the definition of "off-road vehicles" (defined). Provides that this legislation does not become law unless by September 2, 2027, the Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) establishes and funds a remediation program to help mitigate damage to the land, including private property, that happens because of ATV use, and the ADOT establishes and funds a county sheriff law enforcement program pertaining to ATV laws in Arizona to enable the sheriff to have dedicated enforcement of ATV laws. Requires the ADOT to notify the Arizona legislative council of compliance or noncompliance with those stipulations by October 1, 2027. AS PASSED HOUSE.

Requires the committee to create and submit a report by January 1 of each year to the Governor and Legislature that details committee activities, findings and recommendations. Stipulates the committee is repealed after May 31, 2025. AS PASSED BY SENATE.

SB1064 - Conditional enactment; fuel reformulations (Gasoline formulations; air quality.)

Sponsor Sen. Justine Wadsack (R) Summary: Requires gasoline offered for sale in counties with 1,200,000 or more residents to comply with one of six (previously two) listed fuel reformulation options, subject to any waiver issued by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). Requires gasoline produced and shipped to and offered for sale in counties with 1,200,000 or more residents between November 1 and March 31 of each year to comply with one of six (previously one) listed standards, subject to any waiver issued by EPA. Establishes rules for a petition to comply with alternative standards if maintaining listed standards presents a possible shortage of supply. Permits the legislature to petition the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) to allow retail sellers to sell or offer gasoline for sale that does not meet the standards prescribed. Directs ADEQ to submit proposed modifications to the gasoline fuel formulation requirements recommended to EPA.

Requires the Arizona Department of Agriculture to maintain a list of all approved gasoline formulations by area on its website. The balance of the bill applies to selling gasoline or oxygenate by one seller to another, rules for gasoline reformulation in other zoned areas and a final report of compliance or non-compliance by October 1, 2025. (More) AS PASSED SENATE. **Position** Amend

SB1376 - Vehicle loads; restrictions

Sponsor Sen. Shawnna Bolick (R) Summary: Extends vehicle load restrictions from highways to streets and roadways, applied uniformly throughout Arizona and in all its political subdivisions. Exempts vehicles being used for agricultural purposes on a farm. Prohibits enactment or enforcement of an ordinance or regulation that prohibits "cruising" (defined) or limits motor vehicle suspension modifications or bumper heights when the vehicle's operator is engaged in cruising. AS PASSED HOUSE.

SB1567 - Off-highway vehicles; education requirement


Sponsor Sen. Sine Kerr (R)

Summary: Defines "motor vehicle" as any self-propelled vehicle and adds any vehicle operated on water to exclusions. Lists prohibitions for a minor under 12 years of age, between 12 and 16 years of age and someone under 18 operating an "off-highway vehicle" (defined) and prescribes penalties for doing so, including for the parents or guardians who allows those individuals to do so. Creates exclusions if the minor is a passenger and certain criteria are met. Requires a valid license to operate an off-highway vehicle per this legislation and prescribes penalties for violations. Requires the Arizona Department of Game and Fish (ADGF) to certify an off-highway vehicle safety education course that includes verification of completion. Requires that on January

1, 2025, proof of completion of that course is required before the Arizona Department of Transportation or ADGF may issue a resident or non-resident off-highway vehicle indicia per state law. Requires sharing of data between the two pertaining to the indices. Requires the ADGF to develop a report summarizing the program, class, implementation, public response and recommendations for legislation to the Governor and legislature by December 1, 2026. Self-repeals on June 1, 2027. AS PASSED SENATE.

SB1680 - Minors; motorcycle helmets; citations (Traffic violations; photo radar; penalties)

Sponsor Sen. David Gowan (R) **Summary**: Permits law enforcement to issue a citation for a violation of the helmet requirement for minors riding a motorcycle, all-terrain vehicle, or motor driven cycle if the violator is 16 or 17 years of age and has been issued a driver's license or permit. Exempts all three if operated as part of a farm operation and the vehicle is an agricultural vehicle, operated on private property or otherwise exempted by state law. Permits an operator of any of the three to be issued a citation if their passenger is under 18 years of age and not wearing a protective helmet pursuant to state law, or if the operator is under 18 and is not wearing a protective helmet and is in the same group or party as the operator of the initial operator who is at least 18 years of age. Prescribes a civil penalty of \$100 or community service is the person is 16 or 17 at the time of the violation. AS PASSED HOUSE.

SB1681 - Slow driving; left lane; penalty

Sponsor Sen. David Gowan (R) **Summary:** Assesses a civil penalty of \$250 to anyone that operates a vehicle less than the normal speed of traffic

appropriate for the time, place and conditions who operate their vehicle in the right-hand lane or as close to that lane as is practicable, except when passing another vehicle proceeding in the same direction.








Small Town Service: Big City Excellence!



May 10, 2024 ... This week the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) notified Tesla that the company must provide additional information about a recent software recall and update of the Autopilot feature. The recall was announced in December of 2023 and was intended to improve Tesla's driver-engagement systems, which are used to monitor whether drivers are safely operating the vehicle. Failure by Tesla to respond before the July 1st deadline could result in fines of up to \$135 million.

This request by NHTSA comes on the heels of an April report in which NHTSA studied hundreds of crashes involving Tesla vehicles. The report found that Tesla Autopilot contributed to at least 467 collisions and 14 deaths from January 2018 through August 2023. The report said that drivers involved in those crashes "were not sufficiently engaged in the driving task and that the warnings provided by Autopilot when Autosteer was engaged did not adequately ensure that drivers maintained their attention on the driving task."

This issue should be on the top of all motorcyclists' minds as just last month, months after the recall intended to address these problems, a biker was killed by a Tesla reported to be operating on Autopilot.

Later this month, MRF members will be in Washington, D.C. for the 2024 Bikers Inside the Beltway event. You can be sure that this issue and the safety of motorcyclists on the road will be a topic of conversation with hundreds of Congressional offices. The MRF

is working to ensure that every Member of Congress knows what former NHTSA

official Missy Cummings said last year, "It's very dangerous for motorcycles to be around Teslas."
