1 ICE, INTERNAL COMBUSTION ENGINE.

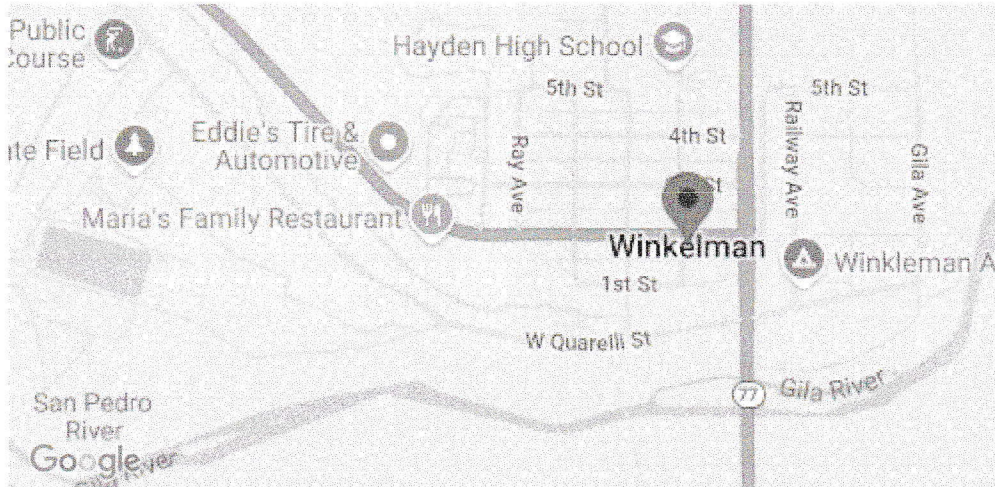
